HOME/SCHOOL COMMUNICATION

In school we use both Class Dojo and email to communicate with families at home. So that we can be sure communication is always effective we are asking that parents always communicate with class teachers via email rather than Class Dojo. Class Dojo will be the main tool for class teachers to send parents reminders/a celebration of something great that has happened during the day/week or regular updates. Class teachers will check emails each morning and will aim to respond to emails as soon as they can but won't normally be able to respond in the day time. If you have something which is urgent and needs to be passed on to the class teacher please ring or email the bursar and it will be passed on.
