WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN CLASSES THIS HALF TERM ?

Here's a small snippet of some of the fantastic learning which has been going on in school and at home this half term.

INFANT CLASS

It's been another busy month in the Infants - everyone has worked hard and continued to show a wonderfully positive attitude to learning at school and at home.



Reception continued their work on traditional tales, predicting what type of plant might grow from a mysterious magical bean and invented amazing porridge recipes for the Three Bears Cafe.

Year 1 and 2 found out about an Incredible Book Eating Boy and wrote some fantastic letters explaining why he shouldn't eat their favourite book.

After exploring different types of paper and techniques such as collage this half term, we moved on to creating our final

paper creations in art - papier-mâché toys! In school, we discovered first hand what happens if you use too much glue, and ended up rather sticky...

We also came to the end of our 'Toys from the Past' topic in History, and it has been lovely to see the children involve their families in this learning and talk about the toys that parents and grandparents played with when they were in school.

We also celebrated Safer Internet Day, exploring the story of Detective Digiduck and how we can check if what we read on the internet is true - we made Digiduck masks and became internet detectives too!

This half term, we began our new Paddington topic, which is off to a great start! In English we have been enjoying reading the story by Michael Bond and thought about what we would do if we found a strange bear in our classroom - lots of children thought it would be a great idea to keep him as a pet (we'll have to ask Mrs Sutton of course!).





YEAR 3/4

We continue to be super impressed with the way all the children in Years 3 and 4 have ac-

cessed their learning through February, whether they were joining us through live classes at home or were physically in the classroom. We want to say a massive well done to all the children and a big thank you to all parents and carers who are helping everything go so smoothly - we know it's not easy!

We finished last half-term with a few special sessions, for example Internet Safety Day when we explored the theme of 'An Internet we can trust'. The children spent time finding out how to tell the difference between 'Fake news' and 'real news'. We also ex-

plored the importance of not sharing infor-





mation about ourselves online. Following that, we explored Chinese New Year which saw us finding out more about this celebration, learning how to count to ten in Chinese and some of us even had a go at learning how to do multiplication using the Chinese method. We also had an eye-opening lesson exploring our half-termly value of justice in more detail. We were shocked to discover that not everyone in the world has a free choice in the religion they follow and we talked about the injustice of this. We learned about the life of Brother Andrew and how he risked his own life to take Bibles to people around the world who were not allowed them or could not get one. We found out about Open Doors which is an organisation set up to support Christians around the world who are persecuted for their religious

beliefs.

As well as our special sessions, we have also...

• finished our artwork based on Lowry and will be putting together an art gallery to display all the amazing work

- found out more about the story of David and learned that eventually he did become King. We had lots of debates about the rights and wrongs that happened during the story of David and Saul and we especially loved sharing our ideas on our class blog on Purple Mash
- found even more songs and dances to keep our minds and bodies active throughout the day
- started a research project into a desert of our own choice to finish our geography topic



- started our new Science topic, 'Sound' and began sharing our ideas of how we think we hear sound
- continued to boost our fitness through our regular workout sessions in PE and began exploring how we combat defenders in invasion games

YEAR 5/6

This month, 5/6 have been working incredibly hard on our automata both at home and in school! Over the course of the half term, we have built up enquiry and design technology skills: looking at automata and figuring out how they moved; examining cams and followers to see different movements; designing our automata, to scale (Miss Gill was incredibly impressed), and finally making our final product. It was a long process to go through, but our final Viking Automata are amazing. There was fantastic individual and teamwork from everyone; it was lovely to see the whole class trying to help each other out and troubleshoot problems at home and in school. FOSS SUPPORT FOR SCHOOL

Some of the funds raised at FOSS events in the Autumn Term have been used to support our children. So far this term we have replaced old globes in each class, purchased a licence for new worship songs: Fischy Music (we can't wait to start teaching the children the new songs!), a set of atlases suitable our infant class. We've alos purchased several bigger items for our EYFS outdoor provision: x2 large outdoor chalk boards, x3 TUFF tray covers and some extra large measuring cylinders. We're planning on using more FOSS funds to develop class reading books to match topics being taught, both non fiction and fiction. Thank you FOSS!
