JULY 2020 UPDATE

At this time of year I normally share with you updates of events which have taken place in school and in our wider school family and church as well as everything which is coming up before the end of term. Although school as we know it has been put on hold for this time, there have been plans to upgrade our wonderful school building which have been continuing. It hadn't been clear if the works would be taking place over the summer break but it has now been confirmed that they are.

The upgrades will include: a replacement of the old strip lighting throughout school; an insulated panelled ceiling in the hall; the renewal of several electrical boards in school; replacement of the double doors from the infant classroom to the staff car park; replacement of the folding doors in Y3/4 which occasionally let in rain and are draughty; the creation of a large storage cupboard where the current hall entrance is; the repainting of most of the school and the resiting of the offices to where the spare classroom is to create a new entrance to school which will include a vestibule/waiting area.

These improvements will ensure our school is warmer, uses less electricity, has a safe and secure entrance accessible to all and will bring our electrics up to standard. It should all be completed by the end of the last week of the holidays. New signage outside will be arranged in September when all work is complete.

I've attached a plan of the works this newsletter email so that you can see the changes which are being made. Our building consultants from Blackburn Diocese (Eric Wright) are overseeing the work and school will be completely closed over the summer break.

RETRUN TO SCHOOL IN SEPTEMBER

Before the end of term I will send out a letter with final information about the arrangements for everyone returning to school in September and key information re the new term. We are looking forward to welcoming everyone back to school and hope that within the classroom, routines will be very much as they were before lock down although we are still waiting for guidance from the government about the practicalities of having all the children back in school.

It is likely that we will still have a staggered start and end to the day as well as staggered lunchtimes and playtimes. A continued priority on hand hygiene and increased cleaning throughout the day will still be in place.

Please can I encourage everyone to follow all guidelines from the government so that we can all beat this disease together. Stay Alert, Control the Virus, Save Lives. Stay Safe.

INFANTS - FOREST SCHOOL OUTDOOR UNIFORM

Although there are still a few weeks to go until the end of the summer term, we're already planning and preparing for the autumn term. For the autumn we are asking that parents provide a set of outside waterproofs for their child which can be kept in school. We intend to continue with our Forest Schools Learning for all infant children but in the light to the impact of COVID-19 each child needs their own set of waterproofs which will be kept in a named bag (provided by school) in school as well as the usual pair of wellies. A set (trousers & jacket) or an all in one cost upwards from £13. School will have some spare sets but in the current situation an individual set from home is advised. We are excited to be introducing the use of recorders in some of our class music lessons from October. For hygiene purposes we will be asking you to purchase a recorder for your child to use in school

which we will buy in bulk so as to keep costs as low as possible - at this stage it is anticipated that each recorder will cost between £5 and £8. We will provide more details next term but the cost can be added to your Parent Pay account. More details will follow in September.
