	GENERAL REMINDERS	
Reception Place reminder	The deadline for applying for a Reception place for September 2020 is fast approaching so if you haven't yet out in an application or you know someone who needs to they need to be in by 15th January 2020.	
Reading	Children should be reading everyday at home for at least 10 minutes. Life is busy but I'd encourage you to prioritise this everyday as it really does make a huge difference to your child's development.	
	On a Thursday lunchtime we are now running a Bedtime Story session from 12.30pm when children can use the library to choose a book to read at home at bedtime which someone can read to them. Reading stories/books to our children is also really important as it helps them understand text, plot, emotion etc. better which they can then apply to their own reading.	
PE Uniform	During the colder months whenever possible we do take the children outside for PE. Our school uniform supplier School Trends, stocks PE hoodies if you would like your child to have one they are available to order and should be in school within two weeks of ordering.	
Books donations	The infants have requested that if you have any unwanted 'lift the flap' books, would you mind donating them to the infant class. Also, if you have books that your children no longer want the school library is always happy to accept donated books.

WANTED	Has anyone got a bookcase they don't need which could be used in school? We're looking for one to go in between the two junior classrooms. If you think you have one please contact Sandra in the office. Thank you.	
Outdoor classroom	The outdoor classroom has been resurfaced and will become a multifunctional classroom space and physical activity area. The School Sports Premium (which is a dedicated grant which schools receive each year rom the government) has been used to fund this project. It will make a big difference to the area which has previously been covered twice a year with bark at considerable expense. This is more cost effective in the long run; provides a better surface for it to be an outdoor classroom and can now be used as a physical activity and storage space for lunchtime physical activity resources. A whiteboard has also been fixed as Mrs Greenbank will be relaunching the Daily Mile initiative after Christmas. The fitness levels of the children has been impacted hugely by having the track—in a twenty minute session the Year 3/4 class ran a total of over 32 miles between them! They self challenged themselves to see how far they could get and each lap was tallied up—one lap in 1/10 of a mile.
