
#### **FOSS UPDATE**


#### **WAKE UP SHAKE UP SPONSORED EVENT**

Welcome back to a brand new school year! It's a time of new uniforms, bags, coats and shoes as well as a time for thinking about all the wonderful things we're going to achieve and do. Our Christian value



this half term is HOPE which is perfect for the start of the school year. Already this September we've had so many different

experiences and learning opportunities both in and out of school and there is so much more to come! We hope you enjoy finding out about just a snapshot of what we have been up to so far!

#### Infant Class:

Our new reception class have settled into school really well and have already been doing some super learning and having lots of

fun. They've been developing their maths skills

through exploring who has the most and who has the least. They have used their construction and balancing skills to create bridges, exploring the outside and going on a shape hunt as well as experiencing their first Forest School session. They've also enjoyed completing lots of activities linked to their book 'Where the Wild Things Are' and they especially enjoyed creating their own monsters using the junk

modelling area. They did an amazing job with their scissor skills and imagination!

Years 1 and 2 have been learning about using bird's eye views to look at our school from above and finding all the key things within our area as well as creating

their own aerial maps.









#### Year 3 & 4:

The Y3/4 children were promoted to year 6 in the second week as they took on leadership in school while year 5/6 were away on their residential to PGL in Shropshire. From stepping in as buddies for our reception children, to becoming table captains at lunchtime, to preparing and delivering Celebration Worship, they were absolutely fantastic! They also had a fantastic time learning a new dance routine in PE with our specialist dance teacher and linked this to finding out all
