- Closing date **Thursday 31st October 2024**
- National offer day is **Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2025**
- In the event of there being more students than places for external students, the following oversubscription criteria will apply:
  1. Looked After Children or previously Looked After Children.
  2. Children with a medical need.
  3. Up to 25 places to children of Christian families (please use the SiF).
  4. Children living in catchment (check Notts CC website), attending a linked primary school and with a sibling in the Academy at the point of admission.
  5. Children living in catchment and attending a linked primary school at the closing date for application.
  6. Other children living in catchment.
  7. Children living out of catchment, attending a linked primary school and with a sibling at the Academy.
  8. Children living out of catchment, who attend a linked primary school.
  9. Students with a sibling attending the academy at the time of admission
  10. Other children living out of catchment.
