## Mini & D D D

This is a small variation of a PODD book that can be used to provide a range of key vocabulary for use whilst at home at this time. It has been kept to a maximum of twenty pages and uses minimal colour for ease of printing at home. This book can be used for direct access, such as pointing, and indirect access, such as scanning.

Below are some simple instructions on how to print and assemble the book at home. The PDF can also be downloaded onto an IPAD or tablet, if printing isn't an option.


There will be a range of videos over the coming weeks demonstrating how the book can be used for both pointing and scanning as well as how it could be used on the IPAD.

## Instructions for assembling mini PODD book:






Print out pages of the mini PODD book and cut around the tabs, leaving the one with the number in. The other three sides can be left as they are.





Optional: Line up the individual pages in a laminate sheet and put through a laminator. Matt laminate sheets are the best as the avoid glare, but any will work. If laminate sheets aren't available, sticking the pages onto card will make the book last longer.





If laminated, cut around the tabs once more leaving a slight edge so that the laminate holds. Hole punch four holes into the top of the PODD book and bind, ensuring there is enough room to turn the pages. You can use string, ribbon or cable ties etc. to do this. If your are worried about sharp edges on cable ties, these can be trimmed and carefully melted using a lighter.
