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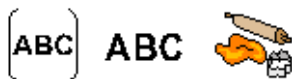

English



In our English lessons this term, we will be studying the story about “Magical Misfits” which is a modern, magical story that we have adapted for our pupils so it is more immersive and engaging. We will continue to focus on the use of communication aids and developing speaking skills. Our writing will be taught in focused lessons and pupils are currently writing their own stories to share with you!

Maths



In Maths this term, we will continue exploring

All will be covered in focused sessions in class as well as whilst out and about at the shops and at work experience.

OCN , Theme & Work Experience

This term we will be continuing with AIM Qualifications and Assessment Group units which all link well with our topic about ‘Making Connections’. We plan to make real-life connections with people and organisations we might not usually come into contact with through the focus on “Connecting to history” - visiting and having visitors from many aspects of historical interest.

AIM units are: Building Confidence & Self Esteem E1, 2 & 3, Becoming a volunteer E3 Volunteering, E1 & 2, Maths – length, time and money, English – reading, writing, speaking and Living in a Diverse Society (E1,2&3)

Work experience opportunities include: Dobbies, Foodbank, Shopping, Farm visits, Craft Barn, Travel Training, Hosting in the café, college visits, Meal Deals and Pop-up shop.

Science



Our Science focus this term will focus on growing organic food for the pupils to use and taste when they are cooking during school lessons. So far we have a lovely salad. Just waiting on the carrots and peas.

PSHE

Our PSHE focus this term is on the topics: Families and people who care for me followed by What is consent?
