

Year 7 and 8 Pupils Get Creative at the Yorkshire Sculpture Park

A group of enthusiastic Year 7 and 8 pupils recently enjoyed a fantastic creative experience at the Yorkshire Sculpture Park, working alongside acclaimed willow artist Laura Ellen Bacon. The trip offered a unique opportunity for pupils to meet the artist in person, hear about her inspirations, and gain insight into her large-scale, organic willow installations.

After learning about Laura's artistic process, pupils rolled up their sleeves for a hands-on workshop, where they had the chance to create their own individual willow sculptures. They also experimented with willow charcoal, using it to explore expressive drawing and mark-making techniques.

One of the highlights of the day was a collaborative project: pupils worked together to construct two large willow spheres, which will be proudly displayed in school as a reminder of their creative teamwork and the skills they developed during the day.

The visit concluded with time to explore the stunning grounds and sculpture trails at YSP, where pupils took inspiration from the wide range of contemporary art on display — and of course, rounded off the trip with a well-deserved ice cream in the sunshine.

It was a memorable day of creativity, collaboration, and inspiration for all involved.

Pupils Help Break a World Record with Jamie Oliver!

Our pupils recently took part in a truly unforgettable experience — breaking a Guinness World Record alongside world-renowned chef Jamie Oliver! As part of Jamie's global Food Revolution Day, they joined thousands of young people from around the world in the World's Largest Simultaneous Cooking Lesson, learning valuable skills while making history.

With over 10,000 participants across multiple venues worldwide, the event was a global celebration of food education and healthy eating. Led by Jamie via a live broadcast, pupils followed his step-by-step guidance to create a delicious, wholesome meal: fresh pasta made entirely from scratch, served with a rich tomato, garlic, and basil sauce.

From mixing and kneading the dough to rolling and shaping the pasta, pupils got stuck in with enthusiasm — learning hands-on skills and gaining confidence in the kitchen. The vibrant sauce, full of flavour and made from simple, fresh ingredients, showed just how enjoyable and accessible cooking from scratch can be.

Taking part in this global event gave our pupils a powerful sense of connection, achievement, and fun—all while promoting the importance of knowing where our food comes from and how to make healthy choices.

Here's the impressive figures that came out of the successful world record attempt:

- 10,515 bowls of pasta made
- 31,545 tomatoes chopped
- 10,515 eggs cracked
- 5,257 garlic cloves chopped
- 21,030 hands washed
- 42 countries cooking together simultaneously



Not only did they cook up a storm, they also helped set a new Guinness World Record — a moment they'll never forget!




