


Yr6 Recommended Read

Wonder by R.J. Palacio is a heartwarming and inspiring story about a young boy named Auggie, who was born with a facial difference. After years of being homeschooled, Auggie faces the challenge of attending a new school, where he must navigate bullying, kindness, and friendship. The book shows the importance of empathy, acceptance, and being kind to others, no matter how they look on the outside. Told from multiple perspectives, Wonder is a beautiful reminder that everyone has their own story, and it's what's inside that truly matters. Afternoon Reading Time

This half-term we are reading the following new books in afternoon reading time:



The Year 6 pupils are reading Coraline by Neil Gaiman, a dark and thrilling tale about a young girl who discovers an eerie, parallel world that mirrors her own but harbors sinister secrets. As she ventures deeper, Coraline must use her courage and wit to escape and save her real family from a dangerous "Other Mother."



The Year 7 pupils are reading The Westing Game by Ellen Raskin, a clever, puzzle-filled mystery in which sixteen seemingly unconnected heirs are brought together to solve the mystery of eccentric millionaire Sam Westing's death. As they compete in a high-stakes game, secrets unravel, and each character must use their wits to uncover the truth and claim the inheritance.



Year 8 pupils are reading The Wave by Todd Strasser is a thought-provoking novel based on a true story, where a high school teacher's experiment to demonstrate the rise of fascism spirals out of control. As students embrace the strict rules and unity of "The Wave," they begin to lose their individuality and question their morals, revealing the dangers of groupthink and blind obedience.

Here is a reminder of some questions to support your children's understanding of what they have been reading and to open up some discussion about the novels:

What has happened so far in the story?

What do you predict will happen next?

How do you think the story will end?

Why do you think the character did _____?

What would you have done if you were the character?

How would you have felt if you were the character?

What images do you see in your head when the story is being read?

How do you picture the characters in your mind?

What are you wondering about as your teacher reads?

What do you think will happen in the next part of the story?
