



HOME OF BRITISH CYCLING


Sports Leaders had one of their leadership trips this ½ term at the National Cycling Centre in Manchester. What a whizz of an opportunity (excuse the pun!) it



was for them to experience a different sport to what they are used to, bringing them out of their comfort zone quite considerably! The trip saw them ride on the velodrome, the indoor cycling arena which is so much steeper in real life(!) in addition to them BMXing on the pump track – the only olympic standard pump track in the country. It was very interesting to witness, with some students who are very confident in other sports such as Football and Rugby actually making the comment "oooh I'm quite nervous" – This enabled the students to understand what it's like to be nervous at something new, empathy being the key skill here; which is needed when they're going into first schools working with the younger students. The concentration and focus required was evident, particularly when they were whizzing round at height on the velodrome. A small few students did experience a velodrome crash, however, showed true grit, determination and resilience in getting up and carrying on. They learnt here about the different types of jobs necessary with the track maintenance worker checking the track for any damage, not realising this was even a thing. Another observation made was how light the bikes were and how they differed to usual, everyday bikes, with the realisation that STEM subjects were incredibly important, linking hugely with Sports Performance. An exhilarating, eye-opening experience had by all indeed!



The day also included students experiencing the BMX side of cycling – I wonder if any of you watched this in Paris 2024?! It was amazing for students to recognise the difference in the bikes and the way the are ridden for the different disciplines. Students got padded up and crash helmets on for the BMXing and were already learning the stance needed for riding the pump track effectively. Naturally, some were more suited to the BMX discipline, however, all still gave it a solid go, inline with the leadership qualities. They were soon riding the humps and bumps, which they thoroughly enjoyed – though in some cases too much speed!!At the end of the session, we then had the opportunity to meet some of the upcoming Team GB BMX riders – a mini Q&A session and listening to a brief summary of their background and how they got to where they are! It was fantastic to see them train, with many of the student's faces showing sheer shock when they saw how fast they went and how many parts of the track they managed to skip due to being in the air!!

Additional general updates/reminders

As well as the whole school accessing the PE curriculum, over 60% of the whole school have accessed a sporting club/activity since September. Lastly, if they're excused, they must still bring their PE kit – this is so that they can still access the curriculum in an alternative role such as a leader, coach, referee, analyst, timekeeper etc. in addition to ensuring they have a dry set of clothes to change into as well as maintaining good habits and routine of bringing their kit.
