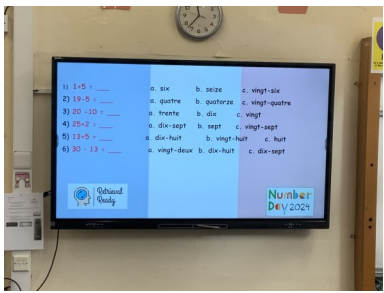
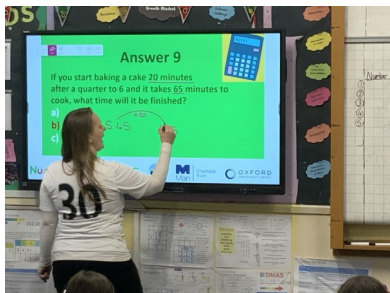

**Ackworth Trip**

On Tuesday 30th January, a number of students from Scissett Middle (myself included) were invited to Ackworth School to watch a performance of Coram Boy. After arriving at the school, we were guided to a central building in which to put our belongings. We were then greeted by the director of the production who took us through an acting workshop whilst narrating to us the first half of the production. The workshop included performances from students and group work, spotlighting on the moments when the director struggled to put together a scene.

After the workshop, we were taken for dinner, curtesy of the school kitchen staff. There were multiple meals ranging on offer from fish to pasta.

Once we had all finished eating, we were guided to the theatre where the performance began:

The plot of Coram Boy is two families, the Ashbrooks and the Gardiners, one owning the largest estate in Gloucestershire and the other making money off women under the pretence of taking their illegitimate children to the Coram Hospital. A member of the Ashbrooks has an illegitimate son and takes it to the Gardiners. They try to dispose of it by burying it in the ground. Eight years later, the mastermind of the child-killing scheme has been hanged and the Ashbrooks are now looking for their missing child. The play resolves with the child, and a number of others, being rescued and the Gardiner family drowning in the sea. Despite the gruesome ending, it was entirely entertaining.

**Inter-form Football Competition**

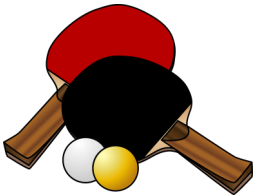
