There were also lots of excellent performances from singers and instrumentalists from all age groups as well as performances by the Wind Band, Pop Choir and String Ensemble. They enjoyed a backstage tour of the building's three performance spaces, learnt about the many careers involved in theatre and took part in a workshop - 'A Day in the Life of an Actor'. Some even managed to observe an initial cast read-through of *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory* the Musical!

Each group played a number of excellent pieces and introduced the different instruments from the group.
