Information/Reminders

As can be seen on the Parish Newsletter (emailed after the newsletter), the search for a vicar to take over from Rev Rebecca continues. Unfortunately, it means that we will need to wait a bit longer for a replacement, but we are blessed that Rev Catherine in so involved in school life and will continue to be until the vacancy is filled.

Please remember to name your child's property—there are number of hats, gloves and scarves in the lost property box which we cannot return.

For children who have school dinners, please remember to ensure the balance is up to date and not in arrears.

Parking is an issue around school but please remember NOT to park on double yellow lines, zig-zag lines or block residents' driveways. Also, the school car park should only be used by parents dropping off for breakfast club or picking up from after school club. Parents should not be using it when bringing/collecting children for the normal school day.

End of School Day

To try to ease the congestion around the gate, please be on the school playground to collect your child at 3.10pm. The bell to indicate the end of learning time sounds at 3.10pm and the class teachers do try to dismiss the children as soon as possible after this time. We do need parents to be on the playground waiting so that we can have a quick and smooth handover and everyone will be heading in the same direction at the same time through the gate. The exception to this are Y1 parents who need to collect their children from Y1 and then, if they have older siblings will, unfortunately, have to go against the main flow of parents leaving the playground. We cannot open the big gate as that creates safeguarding issues, especially when we are on the main road. Please be mindful about where you wait to collect your child, especially if they are in Reception, Nursery and Year 2 as the area around the gate can become very congested.
