#### **Celebrating this week in school**

It has been quiet during our second week back after the holidays as the Year 6s have been on their residential in Lockerbie. There are lots of photographs on the website, if you want to see what they have been up to. You can also see photographs of the Year 5 children with their Reception buddies. They really are amazing at looking after them.

As we have continued thinking about the Christian value of Justice, we thought about doing things for other people, especially when we notice that things are not fair for them. This will link to our Harvest Appeal, when we think about those who live in our local area who do not have enough food. As part of our Harvest Festival (Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> October), we would ask that families bring in donations of tins and packets. This will be distributed via Hala Pantry to other groups providing support. I know that for some of you, things are difficult financially. Please do not feel obliged to bring in food – only if you are willing and able. We will have extras in school for children to take to church, so that they do not feel uncomfortable. If you are finding things difficult at the moment, please let us know as there are groups that can offer advice and support.

During the first two weeks at school we have focused on the foundations of learning – how to be a good classmate and learner. Each class has looked at our school rules and thought about what they mean. We have kept it simple so that everyone across school has an understanding of what they are. They are;

Please ask them about these rules at home and encourage them to make good choices based on them.

#### **Information and Reminders**

Please remember that we are closed on Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September for the Queen's Funeral. We will reopen at 8.45am on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> September.

Just a gentle reminder that school opens at 8.45 and ALL children should be in their classrooms ready for registration by 8.55am. If your child arrives after 8.55am, they are considered to be late. In line with Lancashire County Council (LCC) policy, we need to monitor and act on persistent late comers. We have to record all late comers and this is reported to LCC. We will be contacting you if your child is late repeatedly to find out if there is any way we can help improve the situation – a child arriving once the day has started is disruptive to their learning and that of their classmates. We try not to berate the children for being late, but we do need to try and find out what the causes are in order to improve the situation. At the end of the day, lessons finish at 3.10pm and we do try to get the children to their exit points as soon after this as possible. It does help if you are on the playground at 3.10pm, but please be aware that the children may be out shortly after this.
