
Thank you for all your donations, in total £192.00 was donated at the Afternoon Tea event.

Lovely Weather

Please remember to put sun cream on your child in the morning if it is warm and/or sunny. We understand that this needs to be topped up during the day and therefore would advise sending your child with sun cream (clearly named) which they can apply themselves. We will of course help any child who struggles to do this. Due to possible allergies, school will NOT provide any sun cream and would ask parents to ensure their child does not share their sun cream with another child. Parents can also send their child with sunhat (clearly named) as well. As we learnt on Jubilee Day, it can be a cloudy day and children can still get sunburnt. As a school who likes being outdoors to learn, your child may be outside for long periods of time and they will always be outside over lunchtime (unless it is raining).
