Punctuality & Attendance

The DFE have directed schools to take action in order to improve attendance and punctuality in school. We want to work with parents to do this and would ask that your child is in school everyday, unless they are so ill that they can not learn (**48 hours off is still compulsory after sickness and diarrhoea**). The gates open at 8.45am and all children should be in class by the time the bell goes at 8.55am. If you arrive after the bell sounds, your child will be considered late and we need to record a reason for this lateness. If they arrive before the bell and then dawdle on the way to class, they may also be recorded as late. Please encourage them to get to class as soon as they can, once here.

If your child is absent from school, please remember to let school know by 9.30am via the school office rather than the class teacher.
