### Reminders

<u>Absence:</u> Please remember to let school know as soon as possible if your child will be absent. Please do not be offended if we ask for details of the absence, this is due to new Government guidelines.

<u>Dinner Money:</u> Please ensure your child's dinner money is paid up to date before the holidays. The cost is £2.90 per meal and should be paid in advance.
