

#### Reminders

<u>Punctuality</u>—please remember that school opens at 8.45am and children should be in class ready to learn by 8.55am. If any child arrives after the 2nd bell has sounded, this will be classed as a late arrival and you will be asked the reason for the lateness.

Illness/Medical Appointments—any absence for illness should be reported to school by 9.30am at the latest. <u>Flu Vaccinations</u>- taking place in school on Tuesday 12th November. Nursery children are not included and parents will need to make other arrangements if they wish to have their child vaccinated.

<u>Earrings</u>—some children are still wearing earrings to school. This must be removed otherwise they will not be able to take part in PE.

<u>School Photos</u>—the proof /order form have been given to the children. All orders are online and should not be brought to school.

<u>Secondary School Applications</u>—applications must be made online by 31st October 2024 for September 2025.

<u>Parking</u>—please remember to park safely and considerately. There are still some parents who are parking on the double yellow and zig-zag lines.

<u>Belongings</u>- you may have to buy new uniform over the holiday (children grow). Please take the opportunity to NAME ALL of their belongings in order for them to be returned to their rightful owner.

<u>Friday Family Worship</u>—children are able to bring in certificates/awards when we return after half-term as it will be the usual Friday Family Worship.
