

UNIFORM

If any part of your child's uniform, that is not going to be worn from September, needs replacing before the end of the summer term, please feel free to replace it with an item off the new uniform list e.g. if shoes become too small, you may buy plain black trainers to replace them.

In order to help the children make the change to the new active uniform, they may come to school in the new uniform at any point this term – I know that some children may wish to wear the active uniform on PE days, some may wish to make the change fully and some may want to continue wearing the current uniform. Please do not feel that you need to purchase anything new at this point – I want the transition to be as flexible as possible.
