

School Dinners

Thank you to the 59 parents who responded to our survey about school dinners. I have shared the answers with Dawn, our cook, who will pass them on to Lancashire County Council catering team. In the main, parents appear happy with the variety, healthiness, price and portion sizes. Some comments were made about portion sizes being different for older children. I have been informed that Early Years and Key Stage one (up to year 2) have smaller portions than Key Stage two children. When writing about portion size, some parents suggested that seconds could be offered. This does already happen, but only for the last class in the hall when everyone has been served. We have a rota for Key Stage two children, as we cannot fit everyone in the hall at the same time. Many of you recognised that we provide healthy meals, but that your child does not always like the vegetable options. All the meals are planned based on their nutritional content, and the children are always encouraged to eat the vegetables on their plates, as part of the planned meal, and top up with salad from the salad bar. If your child is coming home complaining that they are hungry, please encourage them to eat everything off their plate and add extras.

We continue to be concerned about wastage. This is not food bought and not served, this is the food that children do not eat and scrape into the bin, so again please encourage your child to eat/try everything on their plate. A common theme for comments were about wanting ice cream and flavoured milk back on the menu. This has been checked with Head Office and unfortunately they were removed due to their high sugar content. The children in the School Council also requested this, so the cook is going to try to see if they could be added occasionally on special menu days. There were a few individual responses that only relate to specific children and/or families and while I cannot respond individually, please be reassured that all information will be passed on.

In good news - the cheese paninis will be returning to the menu following this consultation and we are looking into the possibility of adding soup onto the menu
