# **COVID Guidelines**

Although there has been a change in the legal requirements regarding self-isolation for positive cases, we would request that parents carry on with the previous guidelines, ie if your child feels ill that you carry out an LFT test and if this is positive they isolate for 5 days, test on day 6 and if this is negative then they can return to school, otherwise to test until a negative test or 10 days. Thank you for your continued support.
