


Scotforth St Paul's CE Primary and Nursery School



Information and Reminders

Our **Harvest Festival** is on Monday 3rd October at 2pm in St Paul's Church and all are welcome to join us. The brand new Worship Team have helped to plan the service and will help to lead it. The children will have the opportunity to carry their donations to the front of church during the service. We will have some spare for any who are not able to bring a donation, for any reason.

There is a **SCOT4ALL** meeting on Wednesday 5th October at 7.30pm at The Boot and Shoe. Every member of our school community is a member of SCOT4ALL and we would love to see as many people there as possible. Again, coming to the meeting does not mean that you will be given lots of jobs to do. We hope to plan fundraising events that will take place throughout the year that people can dip in and out of when and if it fits in with family/work life. This first meeting is to come up with the ideas and create a calendar of events – please bring your ideas. We are hoping to raise enough money to be able to install a kitchen in school.

Information and Reminders Cont'd

We are VERY keen to use our **local environment** to enhance our learning, but our main barrier to this is having enough adults to supervise the children. It would be brilliant if we could call on members of our community to support us with our commitment to get outside more. If it is something that you feel that you can help with, please contact me on head@scotforth-st-pauls.lancs.sch.uk with any specific days you would possibly be available. This is not a commitment from you to be available all of the time, I would like to create a bank of willing volunteers that we could contact when we want to take the children outside. Each volunteer would need to complete a DBS check and undergo a short volunteer induction – in line with our Safeguarding principles. In order to be able to take the children outside, they need to be prepared – please make sure your child ALWAYS brings a coat to school. Teachers will inform you when your child's class is going off the premises to use the local area to learn.

A friendly reminder for those who **drop off and pick up** at the office/playground side of school, that we have a one way system for dropping off and picking up at the start and end of the day. In order to keep all children safe, they should not walk through the car park. Children should come through the gate and up the side of the building in the morning. Parents should then exit via the car park. At the end of the day, parents should enter the playground via the car park, but leave (once they have collected their children) via the path. Thank you.

Karate Reading Challenge - what a great start!

Well done to all of those children who have brought back their signed reading records this week showing that they have achieved 15 "reads" since 12th September. It was possible from Monday and it was lovely to see many eager faces receiving their white karate band. A special well done to Reception children who are doing the challenge for the first time! It is not too late to bring in your reading record for your white band and we look forward to seeing some YELLOW bands around school some time soon (1st possible date is 11th October)...

As a school we love books and we expect the children to read/share books daily at home. It has a huge impact on them educationally (developing vocab, empathy, sentence structure, general knowledge etc etc etc) and more importantly, is excellent fun! On the school website (under Curriculum) is a useful page with updated Recommended Reads for KS2 children, more information about the Karate Reading Challenge, and a link to an interesting online session for parents/carers called "Raising a Reader" with lots of top tips.

Please encourage your child to KEEP IT UP and continue to read with them. Even our oldest, most fluent readers can benefit from reading and discussing books with an adult regularly. And what can be better than snuggling up at bedtime and reading (especially as the nights are drawing in!)? ①
