#### Reminders

#### Leave in Term Time

Since the new rules around taking children out of school during term time came into effect in August 2024 there has been a further update from January 2025. A penalty notice for under 15 days leave remains the same. However, for 15 days of unauthorised leave, the Local Authority will review the request and may **prosecute** parents and <u>not</u> offer the opportunity to pay a fine instead.
