#### SCOT4ALL

SCOT4ALL is our name for the school's PTA (Parent and Teacher Association). It is slightly different to a PTA though because every person who is part of our school community is automatically a member. There are different aims for this group support, advice and fundraising are just some of them.

In order to be able to fund projects e.g. creating a new kitchen for the children to use, buy planters and playground equipment we need to raise money - there is not enough in the budget we are provided with. Therefore, we need people to organise and run fundraising events. The more people involved, the better. So far this year, Mrs Atkinson has organised all the SCOT4ALL events and, with parents' help, they have been very successful. However, this is not sustainable and really it should be parents organising events as it is the children who will benefit from extra resources/spaces. School staff will always help, but we need parents to take more responsibility. No-one will be forced to organise all events, but small teams could be responsible for different events.

If you are on Facebook, one of our parents has organised a poll on the SCOT4ALL page (if you are not a member, please search and ask to join) to find out the best time for a meeting to organise some Summer term events - possibly like last year's Fun Fridays. These are really enjoyed by the children and do not take much organising if lots of people get involved. If no volunteers come forward, these would not be able to happen. If you are not on Facebook, we will confirm the meeting date and time via email.

Going to a meeting does not automatically give you lots of jobs to do, it may be that you can just share ideas or volunteer to do a small role, which enables the event to take place.
