You will need to complete a DBS (police check) prior to starting and meet with a member of the senior leadership team to receive some information around Safeguarding and expectations. You would also need to read and sign to say that you have understood relevant policies and procedures. But, please don't let that put you off!!! It would not take long to prepare you and then you can get involved, working with and helping the children.

Rosie the Reading Dog

The children who have received their purple bands in the Karate Reading challenge, have met Rosie the reading dog today. Rosie is a Border/Lakeland Terrier, is very well behaved with children and adults and has "worked" in another school, helping children develop their confidence when reading. Rosie will be based in Mrs Walsh's office and no-one will be forced to read to her if they do not want to. If your child has allergies, we will also keep them away from Rosie when she is in school — please contact the office if we do not already have this information. Rosie will visit school weekly and will snuggle up and listen to children read, without correcting them, interrupting them or asking them questions. I have found that this approach enables children to read without the fear of getting it wrong. They build up confidence and in turn, their fluency and ability improves. The children we feel will benefit most will be identified by the class teachers and they will take priority for reading to Rosie. A risk assessment has been completed and will be adhered to. If you would prefer your child not to take part in this initiative, please contact the office.
