Dinner Money— Price Increase

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, we are contacting anyone who has an outstanding balance. Please ensure when your child orders a meal up until the end of term it is paid for in advance to avoid being in arrears.

CURRENT YEAR 2 CHILDREN

Please be aware that when your child moves into Y3 school lunches will have to be paid for unless you are in receipt of free school meals.

The cost of school meals is increasing from 1st September to <u>£2.60</u>. If you are in receipt of certain benefits, you may be able to claim free school meals. Either ask at the office or go to https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals to check if you are eligible. Please note that if you are already in receipt of FSMs for a child, any other child would have to be a separate claim.

Pupil Parliament

Four of our Year 5s went to Lancaster University today to find out more about one of the protected characteristics age. They discovered that sometimes judgements are made about certain groups of people because of their age and thought about whether these thoughts and limitations are always correct. Once again, they contributed well to discussions and represented the school brilliantly.
