

#### Open Afternoon/Meet the teacher

As we move towards the end of this term, we start thinking about our School Development Plan (SDP) for next year. As it stands, we intend to continue working on writing and further developing the creative curriculum to ensure "sticky learning" – really important strands within each subject that the children build on, year on year. We will also focus on the building work, which will improve our Early Years' area (more details to follow, when they are confirmed), Mental Maths and Special Needs. Over the course of the year, we will focus our training and spending on these five areas. Once the SDP has been written, and agreed by the staff and governors, it will be shared with parents, but I would like to hear your thoughts before it is written. Dinners must be paid for in advance as per our school prospectus. Meals (£2.35/day) can be paid for in cash, cheque (made payable to Scotforth School Fund) or via Scopay and can be daily, weekly, half-termly or termly. If anyone feels they are struggling to pay, please come and see us to discuss.
