Dear Scotforth St Paul's School

As a Scotforth West Councillor I would like to invite Scotforth St Paul's Primary school children to take part in a Lancaster City Council competition. We would like the children to design a poster that can be used to promote a council-led campaign to reduce single use plastic bottles and disposable cups. The campaign message is:

Reduce: Cut down our use of single use plastic and disposable coffee cups

Refill: Use a refillable water or coffee mug instead of single use plastic or cups

Recycle: Plastic bottles are recyclable – make sure you recycle all you can

A set of branding materials have been produced that will be used across the campaign's promotional materials, so we would like the designs to fit within. The attached template has been produced, into which the winning design will be 'inserted'. Children do not need to use the template for their designs, but should bear in mind that the design should be able to fit within its confines.

- **Deadline** – We'd like the designs to be completed and returned before the end of the summer term (Friday July 20). Entries should be sent to Lancaster City Council's Communications Team, Lancaster Town Hall, Dalton Square, Lancaster, LA1 1PJ. If you plan to deliver by hand they can be left with Customer Services at Lancaster Town Hall for the attention of the Communications Team.
- **Categories** – There are two categories. Reception to Year Three, and Years Four to Six.
- **Prizes** – The winning child in each category will win a £25 voucher to spend on books, and the winning school a £75 voucher. Please include the name, school and category on the back of the poster. Prizes and certificates will be presented by the Mayor of Lancaster Andrew Kay.

We look forward to receiving the children's poster designs. I would be grateful if you could confirm that you have received my email.
