

Parking/Road Safety

Despite previous requests to be aware of where parking when dropping off and picking up, it has been noted that certain parents continue to park on the double yellow lines at the corner of the launderette/Addle Street. This is a particularly dangerous area as many of the children and parents use this route to cross at the pelican crossing. It has been noted that one car in particular persistently parks in this area and further action may be taken should it continue to do so.

Continuing the theme of road safety, a parent has contacted school to say that their journey to school involves crossing Ashford Road. They feel that this is a particularly busy junction and raised their concerns with the council highways department and local counsellors to try to find a safe solution.
