School Dinners

The cost of a school meal is going up in September to £2.30 making weekly costs £11.50. Dinner money for next term will be £78.20.

Year 2— please be aware that as the children move into Year 3 they will no longer be eligible for a free school meal.

All school meals should be paid for in advance either on the day, weekly or termly. Payments can be made by cash or cheque payable to Scotforth School Fund or via Scopay. Thank you.

Uniform

Please see the attached information regarding our uniform policy taken from the School Prospectus. School accepts that towards the end of term shoes, trousers, skirts etc_are getting a 'bit small' and you do not want to splash out on new uniform. However, at the start of next term school does expect every child to attend wearing the correct uniform. We appreciate that for some families this is a big outlay and therefore shirts and sweaters do not have to have the school logo, but be the correct colours and most of the supermarkets are doing fantastic deals on school uniform. Skirts and dresses should be of a reasonable length (it has been noted that some of the older children's skirt levels have become rather high). Many thanks.

Clothing - School uniform

The school uniform is smart, simple, readily available and reasonable in price. We hope it will instil in our children a pride in themselves and in their school. All Scotforth St Paul's children wear school uniform. The basic colour is bottle green sweatshirt/cardigan, white or green polo shirt, with grey or black skirt/trousers. Shoes are to be black or brown and of sensible style. Boots and trainers are not permitted, and neither are extreme haircuts/hairstyles or hair colours. Summer uniform may be worn after the Easter holidays unless otherwise announced but it is optional. Summer uniform is green and white check dress or grey tailored school shorts. Sandals must be black, brown or navy and of sensible style e.g. not flimsy, high, strappy or jelly style.

Sweatshirts, polo shirts and (optional) reversible fleece/waterproof coats with the school name and badge can be obtained from our supplier Uniform and Leisurewear, 57 King Street, Lancaster (opposite M & S) telephone number 01524 388355 or visit the website http://www.ualonline.com/. Alternatively many local shops/ supermarkets sell the basic uniform.

Please ensure all items of clothing are <u>clearly marked with the child's name</u>, in order that mislaid items may be identified and returned.

For safety reasons, children are not allowed to wear any jewellery in school. Rings, earrings, bracelets and necklaces are all forbidden. (If a child is to have pierced ears, please do this at the start of the Summer holidays so that earrings may be removed prior to the start of term.) Any child wearing earrings will not be able to take part in PE/games or swimming. This is for safety reasons. Sensible watches are permitted.

The next term is booking up fast already!



Dear Parents,

As the summer holidays quickly approach us, we at 75 Church Street would like to invite you and your family to join us every weekday for a free lunch and activity session throughout the holidays. We call this Apoth-a-kids.

Apoth-a-kids is a family-focused free food initiative which aims to provide a helping hand during the summer holidays. Last year the programme ran from Apothecary Bar & Lounge. This year we have a new home at 75 Church Street, but it is still run and supported by the same people.

During the 2017 summer holidays we welcomed over 200 children and parents into the programme. Not only did everyone benefit from the free food, we had lots of fun taking part in a wide range of activities and made many new friends. Since the majority of the food provided is also intercepted food, and would otherwise have needlessly been thrown away, we also saved tonnes of food from going to waste.

This year we hope to expand our programme and feed many more families in the Lancaster and Morecambe area. For the first time we will also run Apoth-a-kids in Preston! Board game cafe Dice & Donuts, on Butler Street, will adopt the Apoth-a-kids model to feed and entertain children and families throughout the summer holidays.

Apoth-a-kids will run every Monday - Friday between the hours of 12pm - 2pm.

Our aim is to provide a free lunch for children and parents alike, consisting of a choice of soup, sandwiches and at least one hot dish, fruit, yoghurts and treats, plus a timetable of fun activities (see attached.)

You do not need to come for the whole session, just stay as long as you want. There is also no need to book but please spread the word. Children must be accompanied at all times.
