Barton Road Playing Fields

We have been made aware of the LCC planning application relating to change of use of Barton Road playing fields, but only after it was published. Neither School staff or the School Governing Body were consulted, or even informed of the proposal before that. We have used Dorrington Road as our designated playing field for many years, and intend to continue to do so. We have no plans to use any designated playing fields on Barton Road. The Barton Road site is not suitable for use by Scotforth St Paul's as our playing field as it is separated from school by two major roads, only one of which has any pedestrian crossing. This effectively precludes any consideration of using it. We will not benefit from the proposed planning application and do not wish our name to be associated with it.

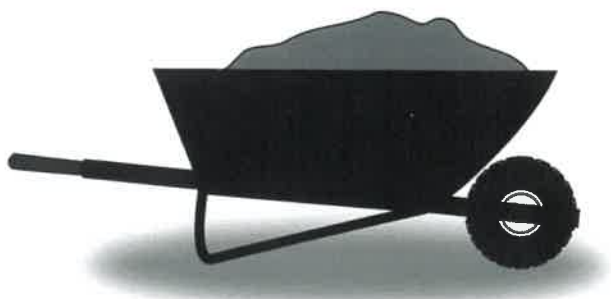

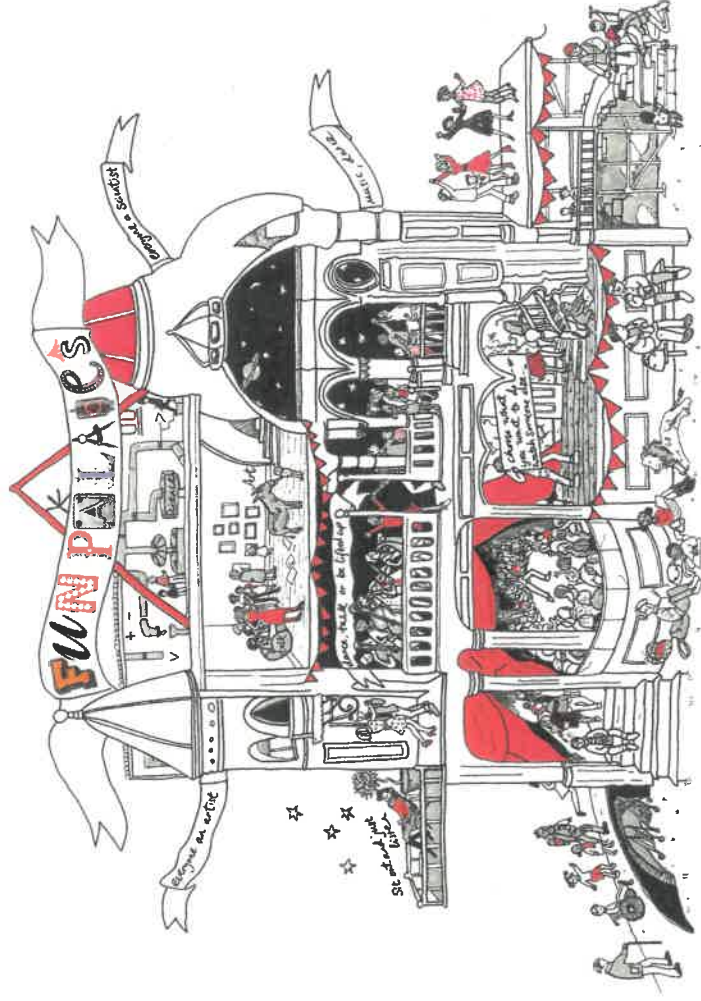
