We Are Reading Festival 2019

Lancaster and Morecambe's FIRST EVER family reading festival is taking place on Saturday 2nd March 2019 @ Lancaster and Morecambe College. Come and join us for a fun filled day. There is **free** parking and refreshments available whilst you enjoy a range of fantastic activities.

This is the district's celebration of a year-long focus on reading activities based in schools from the Lancashire 'We Are Reading' initiative. This has been such a successful initiative within our schools that we wanted to leave a legacy by holding an annual Children and Families Reading Festival.

We are really looking forward to this day long event, please come and join us and support your child's reading journey.

Activities include puppet making, story stones, designing book marks, book swapping and opportunities to meet and chat to local illustrator Tania Sneesby as well as meeting authors Tim Milner, Frank English and Jamie Charles.

Tania Sneesby often displays her amazing art work in illustrator exhibitions and has illustrated books for local author Tim Milner. She will be available throughout the day and will be bringing some of her fantastic work with her.

Local author Tim Milner is a teacher at one of the high schools in Lancaster. He has written a lovely range of books including 'Where's my Hug?' and 'What could I be?' His first book was originally written for his own daughter when she was 3 years old.

Frank English will also be attending the festival. He has written the well-known Jack series volumes 1-4. Other of his titles include 18 Mulberry Road and The Seasons collection which are aimed at children 6-12 years old.

The festival will allow the opportunity to meet up and coming author Jamie Charles who is actually two authors who have combined their names and skills to create a fantastic new fairy detective series - Marshmallow Raisinhorn! Half of this duo actually attended Bowerham Primary School when he was younger!

You will be able to find out more about purchasing books by these authors on the day as well as having the opportunity to chat to them about how they became published authors and being able to listen to extracts from their work.

There may also be merchandise from the authors and illustrators to purchase on the day (as well as ordering) so bring along your purse just in case!

TINS 4 LENT the Branch


Can your class collect ONE TIN for EACH DAY of lent? That's one tin each plus a few extras. Can you collect one of each type of the 28 tins listed below?

Help Lancashire County Council improve services for children and young people with additional needs.

If one or more of your children receives extra help at nursery, school or college then we would really value your contribution to our survey.

The extra help your child receives could be for support with reading, writing or language, often arranged by a Special Education Needs Co-ordinator (SENCo) through SEN Support. Or it could be for more complex additional needs delivered through an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP).

We would be grateful if you could complete the enclosed survey and return it to us via the pre-paid envelope provided. Alternatively, you can take the survey online by visiting:

The survey takes less than 15 minutes to complete and has the potential to significantly shape the future of SEND services across Lancashire. You do not need to give any personal details and there will be no way of identifying individuals.

Practitioners from education, health and social care involved in supporting families are also being asked to complete the survey.

We will use the results to monitor how we are doing and identify where we can make further improvements to our services. The information you give us will also be used in a national report to help improve service in other areas of England.

We will publish the results and our action plan on the Local Offer later this year.
