

Attendance

As it is the start of a new term, we have been analysing our attendance figures once again. As you may be aware, there is a major focus on raising attendance in schools by the government and we are asked to monitor it and act when there are persistent offenders. The target for attendance remains at 96% nationwide and we know that good attendance helps children with their progress.

Having analysed the information from last term, we can see that most absences have been due to illness. As such, we will not be sending letters to parents of all children falling below the standard set (as we have in the past), where we know that illness has been the contributing factor. We will, however, be contacting parents where attendance is significantly low or is falling, especially where there have been unauthorised absences.

We value your support when trying to improve our attendance throughout school and we will continue to try to be understanding when children are not in school because they are not well enough to be here.
