Pupil Absence

Parents are reminded that a pupil absence MUST be reported to school as soon as possible on the day, certainly no later than 9.30 a.m. You can either ring or e-mail the school office. If the phone lines are busy, please be patient and try again and there is the option to leave a message. If you leave a message please leave the pupil's name, year group and the reason for absence.

Poppy Appeal

We are again supporting the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal this year. However, due to the restrictions in place it will be a little different this year. Please see the poster (sent with the newsletter) which shows the items that are available with the suggested donation. If your child wishes to purchase anything, please enclose the donation in an envelope with the child's name and class on the front, together with the item they want and hand to the class teacher. The item will then be sent back to the class for them to take home at the end of the day. Please note that this year there is limited stock and items requested may not be available and would suggest that you only purchase one item for the moment, although we may obtain further stock later.

As always there is ample supply of the usual button hole poppy and a very limited supply of poppy stickers available (donation amount at your discretion).

Dinner Money

If your child has a school meal, please can you ensure this is **paid for in advance** as per our school policy. If debts are incurred, parents will be asked to provide a packed lunch until the debt is cleared. Costs are £2.30 daily, £11.50 weekly and for the half-term £80.50. This can be cash or cheque (made payable to 'Scotforth School Fund') - please send in a sealed envelope with your child's name on the front, or via Scopay. If you still haven't got a Scopay account, please ask at the office.

Covid-19 Testing

If a child has COVID-19 symptoms, gets tested and tests negative, can they return to school even if they still have symptoms?

If the child is NOT a known contact of a confirmed case the child can return to school if the result is negative, provided they have been fever free for 48 hours and feel well.

If the child is a contact of a confirmed case they must stay off school for the 14 day isolation period, even if they test negative. This is because they can develop the infection at any point up to day 14 (the incubation period for COVID-19), so if a child tests negative on day 3 they may still go on to develop the infection.

If a child who was a contact of a confirmed case tests negative, can they return to school?

No, the child should complete 14 days of isolation.

Uniform Shop

As we are in Level 3 restrictions ("Very High") in Lancashire, the half term holiday will be a lot more restricted than usual, meaning that children are not able to have play dates at each others' houses for example. Y5 & Y6 Lockerbie Trip

Y5 –A reminder that the £50 deposit needs to be paid by 27th November at the latest.

Y6— A reminder that parents can continue to pay by instalments with the balance due by 26th March 2021.

Local COVID alert level: very high

This means:

- you must not socialise with anybody you do not live with, unless you have formed a support bubble with them, in any indoor setting or in any private garden or at most outdoor hospitality venues and ticketed events
- you must not socialise in a group of more than 6 in an outdoor public space such as a park or beach, the countryside, a public garden or a sports venue
- pubs and bars must close. They can only remain open where they operate as if they were a restaurant, which means serving substantial meals, like a main lunchtime or evening meal. They may only serve alcohol as part of such a meal
- schools and universities remain open
- places of worship remain open, but household mixing is not permitted weddings and <u>funerals</u> can go ahead with restrictions on the number of attendees. However, wedding receptions are not allowed
- gyms and leisure centres remain open

• exercise classes and organised sport can continue to take place outdoors. These will only be permitted indoors if it is possible for people to avoid mixing with people they do not live with (or share a support bubble with), or for youth or disability sport

• adult gaming centres, bingo halls, casinos, bookmakers, betting shops and children's soft playcentres must close

• you should try to avoid travelling outside the very-high alert level area you are in or entering a very-high alert level area, other than for things like work, education or youth services, to meet caring responsibilities or if you are travelling through as part of a longer journey

• you should avoid staying overnight in another part of the UK if you are resident in a very-high alert level area, or avoid staying overnight in a very-high alert level area if you are resident else-where

You must:

wear a face covering in those areas where this is mandated

You should continue to:

- follow social distancing rules
- work from home where you can effectively do so
- travel to venues or amenities that are open, for work or to access education, but aim to reduce the number of journeys you make

If you log back in to the system during the application period, don't forget to resubmit your application, even if you have not made any changes.
