Week 5

In your pack there is a clear food bag, draw the water cycle on the bag using felt tip pens, see the picture below (permanent ones like Sharpies are best as they won't wash off, but please be careful as they really are permanent and do stain!).



Put water in to your food bag to the level of the sea (about 4cm) and seal your bag <u>completely</u> so that no water can escape (you could put extra sticky tape around the top of the bag to make sure it is properly sealed).

Stick your bag to a window and watch it over the next few days. You should notice the water evaporating to the top of the bag, forming 'clouds' and running back down the inside of the bag. This is a simple version of the water cycle happening in a bag!
