# Geography

• Continue with your Europe project that was sent in the last pack of work, including the matching game and quiz that was mentioned on the project page.

#### Science

- Continuing with our topic of 'Living things and their habitats', when you are on your daily walk or in your garden have a look around to see how many different types of habitats you can find. A habitat is the home of a living organism (plant/animal).
- Think about a variety of different habitats around the world e.g. desert, swamp, rainforest, Arctic, ocean, lake/pond, meadow, woodland. Using the photos of living things in the pack, sort them into different habitats. Try to draw some more living things for each habitat.
- Complete the Minibeast Key sheet.
- Using the pictures provided, have a go at making up a variety of food chains. All living organisms need food to survive. Plants get their energy from the sun. Plants then make their own food in their leaves and are often at the start of a food chain. Plants are eaten by animals. These animals become food for other animals, creating a food chain.

e.g.  $corn \rightarrow rat \rightarrow owl$ grass  $\rightarrow$ grasshopper  $\rightarrow$  frog $\rightarrow$  python  $\rightarrow$  eagle

BBC Bitesize have some great video clips to watch about food chains, habitats, predators and prey.

• Have a go at playing the Predator Top Trump Game, have fun whilst learning. You could have a go at making a few more cards of your own to add to the pack.

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#### French

Year 4 Virtual French Day

This will take place on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> May. Why don't you dress up as a famous French person or in the colours of the French flag? When your parents are shopping before this if they could buy you an item of French food you could eat this. (baguette, croissant, pain au chocolat, brioche, meringue, tarte au citron, brie, camembert, chocolat chaud, profiteroles, crème caramel, crêpes) I have included a French quiz in your pack leave this till the 12<sup>th</sup>. I am going to make some small french flags and bunting to decorate my study before French day. You need to start collecting junk. Boxes, cardboard, cartons, newspaper, straws etc ready to build an Eiffel Tower. Normally we do this in school out of art straws and we measure the tallest. This time I would just like to see how ingenious you can be, any family members can help. We normally play croquet, boules and la marelle. You may be lucky enough to have a set of boules or bowls at home, I doubt many of you will have croquet! La marelle is hopscotch. If you are allowed to you could draw out a grid. The children often use a snail's shell (la coquille d'un escargot) instead of a stone. If you have time, or on another day make a factfile or presentation about a famous French person (living or dead). They could be an arist or designer, a sportsman or a scientist.
