Welcome to our next Year 5 home learning pack!

We have set out learning activities for the next two weeks of this half term. As with the last learning pack, it would be really helpful if those of you who are coming into school as children of key workers could do the activities in order so that you will not be repeating activities on the days you are in.

That is:

- Monday – Maths, Literacy, RE
- Tuesday – Maths, Literacy, History
- Wednesday – Maths, Literacy, Science
- Thursday – Maths, Literacy, Art/DT
- Friday – Maths, Literacy, PE/Music

As ever, make sure you pace yourselves and continue to leave plenty of time each day for physical, creative and relaxing activities, as well as working on these specific tasks.

Maths

- Access the White Rose Hub Year 5 home learning resources at <https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-5/> . Each week, 4 lessons are provided comprising a video and worksheets. We will continue to email the premium worksheets and answer sheets, but remember that the objectives align with those at BBC Bitesize, where you will find more activities and worksheets on the same topics each day. Please complete **Week 9 and 10**. White Rose provide a maths challenge each Friday, or you might choose to work on one of the other maths tasks instead.
- Continue to practice times tables regularly on Times Tables Rockstars. "Hit the button" is also a useful free website for those who need to consolidate other skills such as doubling, halving and number bonds (including within decimals).
- Continue to supplement the daily maths lessons from White Rose with activities of your choice from <https://corbettmathsprimary.com/> and <https://www.themathsfactor.com/> if you wish.

Literacy

- We will continue to follow the planning published by the Lancashire Primary Literacy Team, which has been specifically designed for home learning. Each week, reading and writing activities focus on a different theme. We will email the resources out each week, as they contain links to access a variety of texts and online activities as well as paper-based ones.
- Spelling: Continue to learn and revise the words on the KS2 spelling lists. The more you get under your belt now, the easier life will be in Year 6! If you go to the English and Spelling





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- Resources on www.purplemash.com/scotforth (your individual log-in card is attached to this letter), you will find spelling quizzes for all the spellings in every year group.
- Continue to read regularly. If you read a book which you particularly enjoy, you could create a review and email it to us. We could then share your recommendations with the rest of the class.

Other Subjects

We have set out two more activities for each subject area. Please do the activities in order.

RE: Women of the Old Testament

Activity 4 Abigail

Read the story of Abigail in the book of 1 Samuel 25. You can also watch a video clip of the story at: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=7epdy01xl0>. Draw a comic strip of the story. What characteristics/values does she demonstrate in her actions and why are they so important?

Activity 5 - Rahab

In the book of Joshua chapters 2-6 we can read about Rahab risking her life to help spies sent into Jericho by Joshua. As a result of this, her family is saved when the walls of Jericho fall. You can watch a video clip of the story at: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=pU618R7_Ys (from 52 seconds). Rahab took a great risk for the lives of others. Did she do the right thing? Why? Why not? Draw a picture of what you think is the most important part of this story and write down what you think. (Rahab turns out to be very important in God's big story – look in Matthew chapter 1 at Jesus' family tree – can you find Rahab's name? She is one of the very few women mentioned here. Look out for another woman's name in that family tree too, who we will be finding out about very soon!)

History Activities

Activity 4

Hold your own family Olympics in the garden. Choose your favourite events (modern or ancient) and then award small prizes for the winner of each individual event. What could the overall winner get?

Activity 5

Use your knowledge of Greek Gods from your Literacy work to create a set of Top Trump cards to play with your family.
