They will be encouraged to chop up vegetables as part of role play using kitchen tools. Mrs Todd Bryce will be talking to children about road safety this half term and staying safe in the sun. The children will take part in fun activities and songs to try and get these important messages across.

The older children will now know which school they will be attending in September. We will start to begin the transition by looking in our "going to school bag." It contains stories, uniforms, P.E. kit and other things that children might want to find out about.
