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Dear parents,

Another two weeks of home school lessons! We're nearly at the summer holidays now. Keep going! We can do it! As with the last pack, this one reflects the day to day pattern of lessons and activities I plan to teach in school and would like you to follow at home. Therefore there are lessons for each day for phonics, maths, literacy and topic.

Maths:

I will continue to follow the White Rose Home learning lessons from the summer term week 6 (week commencing 1st June). I will then teach the lessons for week commencing 8th June the following week.

I will start each Maths lesson with counting in ones from different numbers up to 20 and then back down to zero.

I will also introduce counting in fives to the children. I will do this in a very similar way to the suggestions on the following video:

I have included a hundreds square in the pack so you can complete the activity in the video with your child.

Please also keep going with number recognition and ordering, reinforcing the idea of numbers above 10 being made up of 1 ten and the correct number of ones or the number is made up of that number of ones.

Please don't say for example, 12 is made from 1 and 2. I know it's more long winded but please say it's made of 1 ten and 2 ones or 12 ones and it is written using the digits 1 in the tens and 2 in the ones column.





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Phonics:

I will continue with the DfE phonics lessons from Lesson 24

and continue watching them in order. So in school, we should end at Lesson 33 before the next pack.

Please also keep going with the dictation words and the 72 tricky words. Correct letter formation also needs to be reinforced and the digraphs/trigraphs already learnt. To this end I've included letter formation practice using the digraphs/trigraphs.

I have also included some reading comprehension sheets.

Literacy:

I will be following LPDS lessons found in your pack. I have split the lessons into days and provided the resources I will use in school in each day. I will email you an electronic copy of the sheets to make following the links easier.

You will also find some 'magic' beans to plant on the Friday of Week 4. In school, we are going to plant the beans in clear plastic cups next to the side so we can see the roots and shoots.

Topic:

Our topic for 'Journeys' will continue.

As last time, in your pack, there are suggested weekly activities that I will try my best to complete with the children in school.

At home, I would again suggest you pick and choose from the week's activity as suits you and your child.
