## The Great Scotforth Sponsored Read 2020!

Dear Parents/Guardians,

To celebrate World Book Day here at Scotforth we are running a **sponsored read** between **Friday 14**<sup>th</sup> **February and Friday 6**<sup>th</sup> **March** (the end of World Book Day week). We'd love your child to join in. The money that we raise will be split two ways: half towards St John's Hospice (our charity this year) and half towards our reading books in school.

Pupils can choose whatever they want to read - from comics to classics and audio books to blogs. They are not being assessed: it's all about reading for fun. Hopefully they will be motivated to read because the money they raise in sponsorship helps to provide new books for school and also support a really worthwhile charity.

All you have to do is:

1. **Take a look at what they plan to read,** or help them complete their reading challenge (which ideally would have them read more than they would normally).

Each child can set their own challenge which could be linked to a list of books they would like to read, the number of books they want to read, how many minutes they want to read for each day, or how many pages they want to read a day. Remember they can read whatever they want: books, e-books, poetry, comics – anything goes! Sharing books is fine too (in fact recommended!) as well as listening to audio books. The key thing is that each child enjoys reading and sharing stories/books.

- 2. **Help your child find sponsors among family and friends**. This can be as many or as few people as you are able. Please do not let it become a burden! Every little bit helps.
- 3. Help your children return the money to school by Friday 13<sup>th</sup> March.

As well as the Sponsored Read we will be celebrating reading across the whole week of World Book Day at Scotforth. Some of the events will include:

**Dress up as a book character** on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> March (not the traditional Thursday as one class has a trip that day). Please do not feel you need a fancy/expensive costume for this!

## RE: World Book Day

World Book Day is celebrated in many primary schools in Lancashire. **5** Things you can do to support children



- Discuss what they enjoy and why (apps / Favourite vloggers/ website / social networks).
- Talk about how and who they share their lives with online – make sure to touch on what they would and wouldn't share.
- Have a chat about what their online identity means to them and how they feel it reflects who they really are.
- Discuss the issues they may face such as pressure to conform or encountering negativity and provide guidance and advice.





## Get them to think critically about online and offline influences

- Encourage them to think about the intentions behind what people share and be sure to check sources of information if they seem too good to be true.

  - Make sure they have a varied digital diet to ensure they are exposed to a range of ideas that will give them a balanced view of the world.




## **Encourage them to review** their data and privacy

- To ensure they stay in control of the information they share online, get them to regularly check who they are friends with online and what data they are showing on the platforms they use.
- Doing a regular Google search on their name can be a simple way to manage what content is visible to everyone or remove content that may be incorrect or harmful to their reputation.



## Highlight the importance of being #FreeToBe online



• Discuss safe ways for them to stay authentic to who they are online. This could be only sharing certain content with people who offer positive encouragement and avoiding and reporting toxic environments online

## Stay engaged with what they do online

- Have regular check-ins about what they do online to be better prepared to offer your support.
- Steer them towards apps and platforms that will support their passions and help them express who they are.
