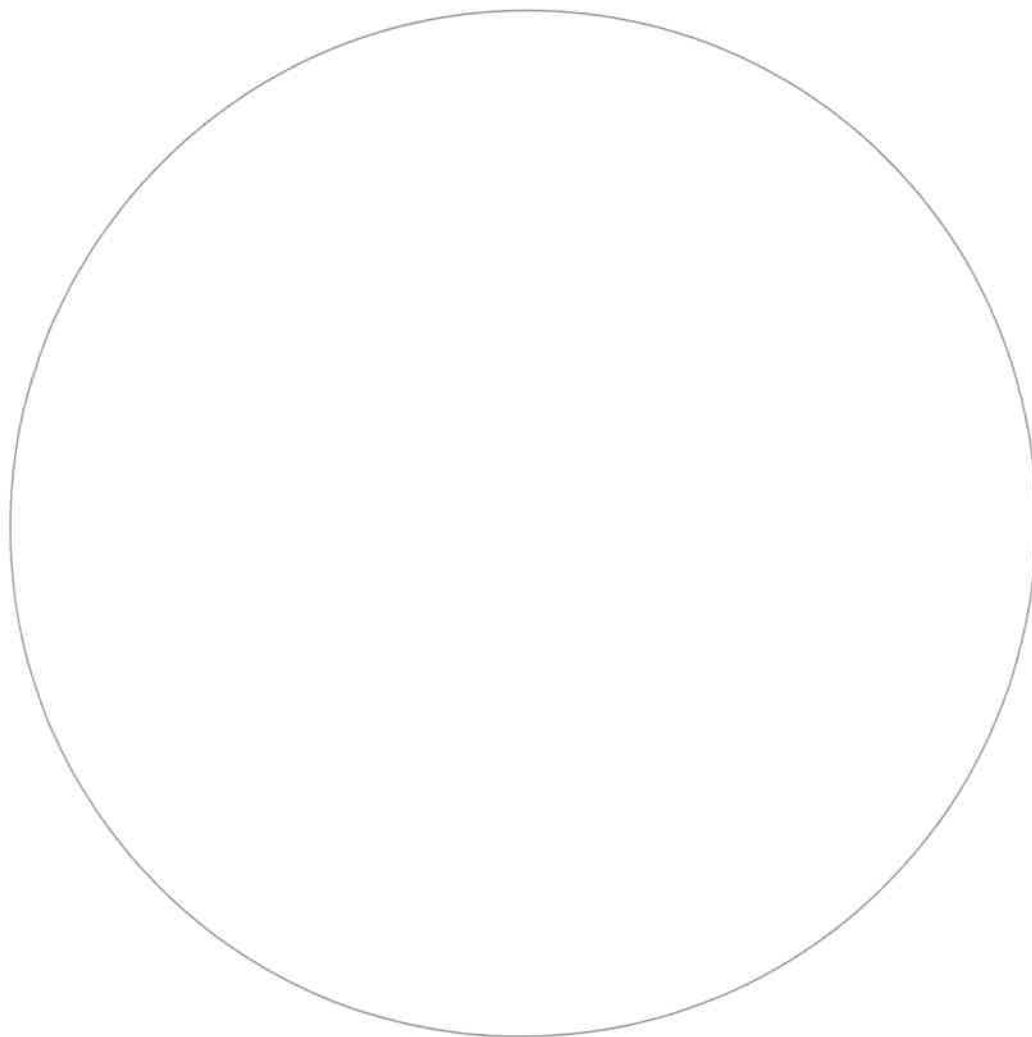
19th July end of term disco

TOURNAMENT MEDAL DESIGN PLANNER AND TEMPLATE

Here are some planning tips. Make notes to help your design here:

What colours might you use? You will want it to stand out.	
Will you want a date on the medal? Most medals have a year shown on them.	
What images might you use for a football tournament medal? Or do you want a modern design?	
Think about the size of your medal? You will want people to be able to see it clearly.	
Think about the weight. Don't make it too heavy or it won't be comfortable to wear around the neck.	
Medal winners will want to keep their medal for years to come. It needs to be strong and not too fragile.	
Will your medal be a WINNERS medal or for BEST TEAM PLAYER or for FAIR PLAY or something else?	



Choose how big you want your medal to be; use the circles above as a guide. Cut it out carefully. Use the materials you have available and recycle them to create an amazing medal. Don't forget to leave space for dates or words you might need. Get creative!
