Snacks, hot and cold beverages and alcoholic drinks are on sale before the show and during the interval at the Williamson Park Café. You can also bring your own picnic to enjoy.

What about the weather?

The Dukes Park show is an all-weather outdoor experience which is always a fantastic evening out for everyone. Come with waterproofs and be prepared for all eventualities!

Unfortunately dogs are not permitted to any of our performances.

Is the show accessible?

Each scene takes place in a different location around the park and walking to some scenes involves steep slopes. Want to learn how science helps protect your local areas? Want to find out how you can become involved?

Come and take part in our **scientific discovery trail** on the shores of Windermere. Try your hand at measuring **algal blooms**, test which plants can prevent **soil erosion**, learn how caring for the Lake District can prevent **flooding** and how woodlands, waste and even cow dung can be made into **bioenergy** to warm your homes and power industry. Take home a goody pack and become a nature recorder, helping scientists monitor and protect nature.

On the day

Activities are spread around a circular 2km marked trail with a mix of paved tracks and woodland trails, starting at the Harrowslack car park (grid reference SD338960).

Arrive any time between 10am and 3pm. We'll greet you and point you in the right direction.
