There is a fashion show at the Parish Hall on Thursday, 11th April. Tickets are available in the school office - £7 including wine and nibbles. (Poster attached).

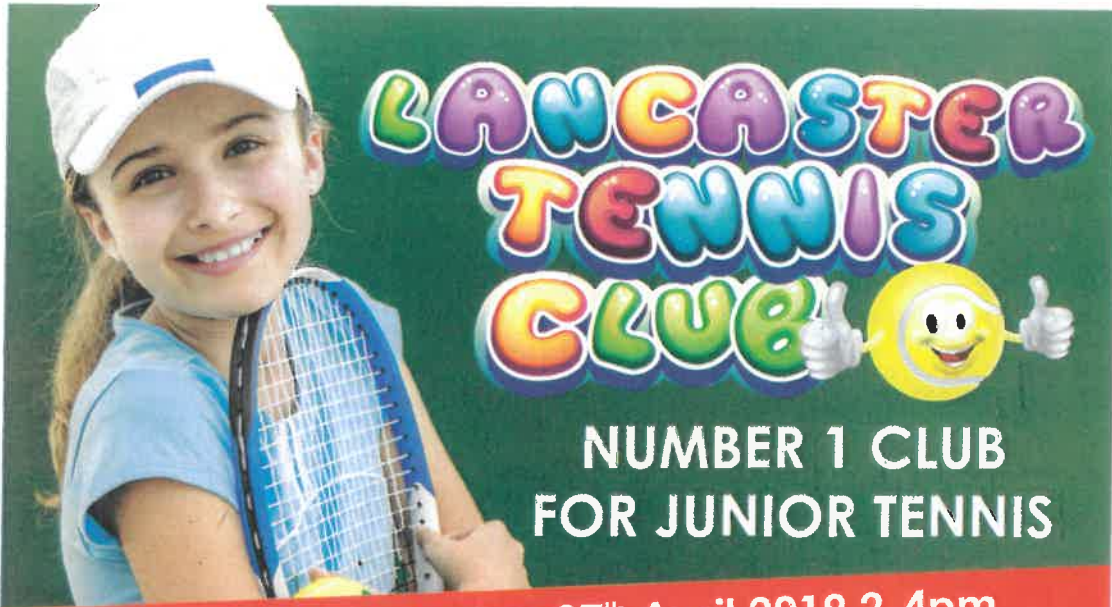
### FOSSY Easter Activities
