Why is reading at a primary level important?

- 1 in 6 people are functionally illiterate (struggle to read unfamiliar topics/sources).
- 1 in 6 adults struggle to apply for a job due to their literacy skills.
- 50% of people in prison are functionally illiterate.
- Poor writers and readers will not apply for certain jobs.
- High levels of anxiety are reported in adults with moderate reading difficulties when faced with filling out a form.
- After the age of 5, disadvantaged children will struggle to read and close the 'gap' between themselves and their peers.

Principles of reading success:

- Be guided by research
- Teach phonics well
- Language and vocabulary development
- Develop fluency
- Breadth of reading (reading mileage)
- Whole class reading (default)

Let's talk phonics

Phoneme: Smallest unit of sound.

Grapheme: Letters used to make the phoneme.

Also known as...

Phoneme is the sound it makes and the grapheme is how we spell it.
