We will do this by providing a structured support plan that carefully outlines the needs of the child to provide measurable, realistic targets to aspire to, with the guidance and support of the adults in school and at home as well as regular liaison with external agencies, where needed.

In the Early Years we would support our SEND pupils through early intervention, to develop in the prime areas and learn though play. Interventions would be carefully developed to support friendships, communication and language and personal, social and emotional development.

In KS1 and 2, high quality teaching and tailored 'in class' fluid interventions will support children in becoming confident individuals who recognise how to drive their own learning forward. The opinions of the children are paramount and they are involved in every step of the way to develop inspirational targets to work towards. Support within the school is continuously reviewed and evaluated to ensure that it is relevant and impactful.

We believe that providing children with the opportunity to develop life skills and experiences will support children with their social and emotional needs. We do this by providing a range of opportunities like Forest School, Media sessions, Talk Time as well as offering a vast array of residentials from Year 2 onwards linking carefully to their learning.

Our SEND pupils leave school as independent, resilient and more confident young people who are aware of how to work to their strengths and are active participants in their learning journey. They move forward having been nurtured and cared for. They achieve their potential by having their needs catered for by a bespoke tailored curriculum to support their academic, emotional and physical needs. They progress into KS3 with confidence and resilience for the future with strategies to self manage their needs.
