!! CLASS NEWS !!

NURSERY: This half term we are covering people who help us and we have lots of visitors coming in to talk to the children e.g. dentist, paramedic, nurse, vet etc.

RECEPTION: Reception have gone back in time to explore all things prehistoric. We have named dinosaurs and discussed what happened to the dinosaurs and how we know they existed. As we look closer to the celebration of Easter and Spring, we are investigating eggs and the animals that lay eggs.



YEAR 1: Year 1 had a fabulous educational visit to Tamworth Castle. They used their learning from previous history lessons to identify the features of the castle and were immersed into castle life and the variety of roles and responsibilities. We are looking forward to using what we experienced to answer more enquiry questions.



YEAR 2: This half term in Year 2 we are exploring lots of new things including vehicles in DT, plants in Science and London in Geography. We have linked our London learning to both the past and the present following on from our Great Fire of London learning last half term and are even reading about different places in London where parts of the Harry Potter movies were filmed.



YEAR 3: In Year 3 we have been focusing on the Romans in history, volcanoes in geography, forces in science and inventors in DT. We have also had some tadpoles in the classroom - it has been fascinating watching them start to change.



YEAR 4: In science, we have been looking at the digestive system and how to keep our teeth healthy. We have also completed a STEM project where we had to come up with a potential solution for a design problem. This half term ended with us having lots of fun at Chasewater.




YEAR 5: This half term we have been engineers! We have been designing and constructing suspension bridges. In history we have been focusing on the British justice system and compared to the Viking's justice system. Our research has been fascinating.



YEAR 6: In English, we have been delving into Oscar Wilde's classic tale, *The Selfish Giant*. In Maths, we have been mastering decimals and percentages, developing a strong understanding of how they relate to one another and applying our knowledge to real-world scenarios. Our history lessons have focused on Joseph Cadbury, learning about his impact on the chocolate industry and the social changes he helped to bring about. In Science, we have been investigating Evolution and Inheritance, exploring how traits are passed down and how species adapt to their environments over time.
