#### **Careers Curriculum Overview (CIEAG)**

At Astley Community High School our careers curriculum provides our students with comprehensive, high quality careers guidance and advice to ensure that they are fully equipped to meet the demanding requirements of the 21st century employment sector

We seek to ensure that our students possess the skills, knowledge, and opportunities needed to make well-informed choices about their future careers. We recognise that employability or work-readiness is becoming more and more important when potential employers look for people to fill vacancies and our rigorous programme at all Key Stages ensures that our students fulfil those requirements.

Our careers policy aligns with the Gatsby Benchmarks, a framework for effective careers provision, and is designed to support and inspire our students in their career exploration and development.

At the heart of all of our careers provision is a desire for students to look to develop their knowledge and skills in areas that they enjoy and thrive in, to enable them to begin further education, careers and employment which spark their curiosity and develop their attributes to their full potential.

#### A Dedicated Careers Team

We have a dedicated Careers Team responsible for the planning, coordination, and delivery of our Careers Program. The team consists of qualified Careers Advisors and experienced staff members who work collaboratively to ensure the provision of consistent and effective careers guidance across all year groups.

#### **Evaluation and Review**

We continuously evaluate and review our careers provision to ensure its effectiveness and relevance. We collect feedback from students, parents, and staff, and use this information to make improvements and enhancements to our careers program, ensuring it remains aligned with the evolving needs of our students.

Our Careers Policy, guided by the Gatsby Benchmarks, is designed to provide our students with comprehensive and effective careers guidance. By focusing on encounters with employers, workplace experiences, curriculum integration, and personalised support, we aim to empower our students to make informed decisions, develop their skills, and pursue successful and fulfilling careers.

This programme will be reviewed by 30th September 2025.



# The Gatsby Benchmarks

The Gatsby Benchmarks were developed on behalf of the Gatsby Foundation by Sir John Holman. They define what world class careers provision in education looks like and provide a clear framework for organising the careers provision.

Gatsby Benchmark	Provision at ACHS
A stable careers programme	We have developed a stable and progressive careers program that caters to the needs of our students from Year 9 to Year 13. This program is designed to provide a comprehensive range of careers activities and experiences, enabling students to develop their understanding of different careers, industries, and pathways.
Learning from careers and labour market information	We regularly update our careers library and online resources to provide accurate and up-to-date career and labour market information. Students have access to information on job trends, educational requirements, and progression routes, enabling them to make informed decisions about their future career choices.
Addressing the needs of each student	Each student has access to the Morrisby platform which provides a student with suggestions on careers, courses and apprenticeships based upon their own personality, aptitudes and likely academic performance. Students are actively encouraged to apply for courses and apprenticeships that are most suitable to their own needs.
Linking curriculum learning to careers	We integrate careers education into our curriculum, ensuring that students can make connections between their academic studies and the world of work. Careers-related activities, projects, and assignments are incorporated into different subjects to develop students' understanding of the skills required for various career paths.
Encounters with employers and employees	Every student in each year group has at least two careers assemblies with two different employers. Students get to visit the national careers fair and the national apprenticeship show in 12 and 13. Students in all year groups get to meet a vast array of employers at our own careers day in February.



Experiences of workplaces	We offer students opportunities to experience workplaces firsthand through work experience placements in year 12. These experiences enable students to gain valuable insights into different career environments, develop employability skills, and make informed decisions about their future career paths.
Encounters with further and higher education	Every student in each year group has at least two careers assemblies with two different universities each. Students get to visit local universities in Year 12 and 13. Students get to meet a large number of universities at the UCAS fair and also at our own careers day in February.
Personal guidance	We provide impartial and professional careers information, advice, and guidance to all students. Our qualified careers advisors offer one-on-one guidance sessions to year 11 and year 13 students and students in all year groups attend careers events to support students in exploring their interests, strengths, and career aspirations.

# Visiting Speakers and events at Key Stage 5

Our Sixth Form programme provides support and guidance on applying for Level 3 apprenticeships, employment opportunities and university courses. In Year 12, students follow a comprehensive careers programme to ensure that they are fully informed and have the knowledge and skills needed to make the decisions for the next stage in their career journey. During tutorial time and assemblies, they will learn about:

- Employment (including the impact of part-time jobs)
- Understanding National Insurance and Tax
- Investigating Future Career Paths
- Introduction to Next Steps university terminology workshop and Careers Ideas;
- Transition Morrisby workshop
- Northumbria University campus trip to learn about the benefits of Higher Education (HE)
- Apprenticeships
- Oxbridge preparation.

#### Impartial Careers Advice and Guidance

The school employs a qualified Careers Advisor from CareerWave who meets with every student in Year 11, as part of a rolling programme. Students are able to gain individualised advice and guidance on their proposed courses and routes post 16. The Careers Advisor can also be seen by any student at any time by simply making an appointment.

Each student is provided with a bespoke action plan, which is routinely updated after each meeting and recorded on Morrisby so that students can view this at any time.
