

## Code of Conduct – Parents / Carers and Swimmers

We ask you as parents / carers and swimmers agree with the following:

- Provide any relevant health conditions/concerns and to report any changes in the state of your child's health to the teacher prior to the lesson.
- Ensure that the school has up to date contact details as required
- Ensure your child turns up no earlier than 5 minutes before the start of the lesson
- Only 1 parent/carer to bring the child to the lessons and no siblings should be brought to the lesson
- Children to be brought to the lessons ready to swim and enter via the cubicles
  
- Children are expected to:
  - listen and obey instructions given by the Teacher or Lifeguard and comply with any safety regulations. No running or pushing is allowed
  - consistently display high standards of behaviour and report poor behaviour by others to an appropriate member of staff.
  
- Parents are asked to:
  - not to bring children to lessons if they are unwell or have had sickness and diarrhea within the last 48 hours. In addition, they must be 48 hours clear of symptoms before returning to lessons.
  - vacate the changing area as quickly as possible after lessons, due to limited space
  - wait in the changing rooms while the lesson is taking place. Please do not wait poolside.
  - not to use mobile phones or recording devices on poolside or in the changing rooms in accordance with the SVF Online Safety Policy. [Policies | Seaton Valley Federation](#)
  - to behave responsibly as a spectator during lessons and treat other customers and staff with due respect in accordance with the school's commitment to diversity and equality.
  - not to use inappropriate language within the school environment.
  - respect the privacy of others, especially in the use of changing facilities. Parents should not be in the changing room while children are changing unless their child is of an age where help is required from parents or if the child requires additional specific assistance
  - ensure children are aware of the code of conduct.
