Northumberland Youth Elections

KS3 Careers Fair



On Friday, our Year 7 and 8 pupils were able to visit our onsite Careers Fair, organised by Mr Drought at the High School, as part of the Careers Advice, Information and Guidance programme that we have in school. They were able to visit stands from a variety of organisations such as universities (eg Durham and Newcastle), employers, (eg NHS, Nissan, KPMG) and colleges and have meaningful conversations with employers and education providers about a wide variety of careers and career routes. The children were really well engaged as they start to think about their futures.



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Nature Park Project

This week we were excited to launch our Nature Park project as part of the National Education Nature Park programme, a nationwide initiative that supports schools in developing green spaces and monitoring local biodiversity. Pupils began work on developing our Forest School area, where we will be planting a variety of plants and creating an environment that encourages wildlife to thrive. The project began with pupils mapping the area, and this will guide the next stages of development. Stay tuned for further updates as the project grows!



Dance City Ballet Sessions

On Monday, we were very lucky to be visited by members of a professional ballet company from Dance City, Newcastle, who led inspiring workshops with our pupils focused on developing ballet skills. For some pupils, this was their first opportunity to try ballet and to meet professional dancers, making the experience especially memorable. The sessions were engaging, inclusive, and full of enthusiasm, and a wonderful time was had by all.


Safeguarding Update - Supporting safe use of AI



David Long's '*Heroes: Incredible True Stories of Courageous Animals*' is an illustrated non-fiction collection that explores the extraordinary roles animals have played alongside humans, particularly during wartime. The book features 33 true accounts of diverse creatures—including dogs, cats, horses, pigeons, and even a bear—that demonstrated immense bravery and loyalty in the face of danger.

Free School Meals

It is always worth double checking if your child is eligible for free school meals. If your circumstances have recently changed or whether you've never checked before, the process is very straight forward:

For every pupil who is eligible they receive £2.60 lunch credit every day and the school receives additional funding which can be used to support learning and progress through the pupil premium grant. Lunch Account Balance

Please check your child's lunch account balance, and top up as necessary. We will never allow your child to go hungry, and should they not have enough money on their account then we will ensure they are able to buy a Main Meal Deal by granting them a temporary overdraft for that day of £2.60. You will then receive a message via MCAS advising you that you need to top up their account. This temporary overdraft facility will not be extended for additional days and should your child not have enough funds in their account the following day they will only be provided with a basic sandwich and drink. Our expectation is that you will top their account up immediately so they have a positive balance again.

MCAS Contact Details

Please remember to double check that your details are correct on MCAS. When you make a change in My Child At School, it updates the systems that we use to contact home. This also means that we don't make a mistake in the spelling of an email address or taking down a number incorrectly.
